## Christian Football League team accepting players

(Submitted by the Shoreline Breakers)

The Shoreline Breakers of the Christian Football League (CFL) are accepting registration from boys in grades nine through 12 for the 2010 fall season. A junior high team may be formed if sufficient interest is shown from boys in grades seven and eight. The Breakers practice and play their home games in southern Muskegon County and northern Ottawa County. Boys from Whitehall/Montague to Holland to Nunica/Coopersville are welcome to join. The team consists of boys who are homeschooled as well as those who attend Christian or public schools. Previous playing experience is not required.

The Christian Football League consists of teams throughout Michigan. It is committed to the spiritual growth of its members as well as providing an opportunity for boys to play football who might not otherwise have access to a team. As the CFL enters its third year, it has established itself as a wholesome, competitive league for homeschoolers, boys who attend Christian schools without a football team, and boys who attend public schools but get little or no playing time.

### Frequently asked Questions:

• **What age do you have to be to participate in the Christian Football League of Michigan?**

Currently, the CFL-MI provides tackle football for athletes starting at the seventh grade level and going through the 12th grade.

Summer camps for 2010 will be open to athletes ages 13-18.

• **What are the costs for each player?**

Yearly costs are \$200 per player for 2010.

There will also be some costs for purchasing a girdle, mouthpiece and cleats.

• **How many practices will there be each week?**

Practices begin the first full week of August. They will be Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, with most games on Saturday. Practice times will be approximately two hours per practice, usually beginning at 6 p.m. Practice fields will be located in the Fruitport/Nunica area.

• **What will the schedule look like, what date practice starts and when the season ends?**

Games will begin after Labor Day and will conclude by early November. Opportunities may also exist to play in mid-November against out-of-state competition.

• **How many games will be played?**

Regular season will consist of eight games (six games for the seventh and eighth grade teams). Up to four teams will be in the playoffs. An all-star game consisting of equal numbers of invitations from each team will be played the day of the championship game.

• **Will athletes outside of homeschooled or Christian school kids be allowed to play, and can athletes who are not Christians play?**

It is not our intent to exclude anyone, but there are some parameters. There is a standard of play expected that would glorify Christ. We have standards for our coaches so they will be qualified to lead and model proper behavior for the players.
