Village council greeted by overflow crowd

The May 16, 2011 Fruitport Village Council meeting took some council members by surprise as they greeted an overflow crowd comprised mainly of village business owners. Also present were Township Supervisor Brian Werschem; Mark Lee from Prein and Newhoff; and Matt Farrar, township DPW director.

The big attraction to draw such a sizeable crowd is the new proposed master plan for the village. The Third Street Business Owners Association was formed on April 28 when a group of business owners met to discuss the proposed changes. The changes to the master plan and the zoning regulations were suggested by a hired consultant who was paid \$10,000 by the village council.

While the proposed regulations create many issues for the business owners, the primary discussion at the meeting centered around the need for a sewer system in the village.

Police protection in Norton Shores and Ottawa County? Editorial by Ron Cooper

A Fruitport Township resident had a dump trailer stolen about three years ago. At the time, he lived in Ottawa County about a mile from Fruitport Township. He made a police report with the Ottawa County Sheriff in August of 2008.

He got the feeling that not much was going to be done about it at the time even though neighbors had seen the theft taking place (not realizing it was a theft) and could describe the vehicles and individuals involved.

He kept looking for the trailer over the years. It is a real neat trailer and there were some changes he had made to it, so he thought he might eventually spot it somewhere.

Recently he saw what he feels is his trailer at a Norton Shores business. Norton Shores police officers were told about it, but they said he had to go back to the Ottawa Sheriff's office because it was stolen in Ottawa County. They did not show any interest in identifying the trailer as the one stolen or in getting involved at all.

An Ottawa deputy looked into it and agreed that the found trailer came back as stolen. The VIN number had been scratched off. When contacted, the businessman said he had taken the trailer in trade from a man from Nunica who was unable to pay what he owed. The deputy informed him that the trailer had been stolen.

The next day, the deputy returned to the business to check further on the trailer and discovered that the trailer had been stripped of its wheels and was left parked on blocks. A second VIN number was located on the trailer, but it was not quite the same as the number on the front that the original owner had registered. As a result, the deputy claimed the trailer had to remain with the businessman.

Despite the fact that several individuals can identify the trailer as the one belonging to the Fruitport Township resident, it appears that, unless he takes the law into his own hands, he will be unable to have his stolen property returned to him.


