Randy Hekman
(Republican candidate for United States Senate)



Randy Hekman is a graduate of MIT and George Washington University Law School. As a naval officer in the Vietnam era, he served in the office of the Secretary of the Navy in the Pentagon. Returning to his native Michigan, he was an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney before running in 1974 for Probate-Juvenile Judge.

Elected as the youngest judge in Michigan, he served in this role for 15 years; helping to start a number of programs for families, including one to deal with victims of child sexual abuse. He also authored *Justice for the Unborn*, which detailed a case he had as a judge. Re-elected twice, Hekman left the bench in 1990 to form Michigan Family Forum, a family policy advocacy group in Lansing.

He has also been the executive leader of two other non-profit organizations and started his own for-profit business dealing with Low Energy Nuclear Reactions (LENR). He announced his candidacy for US Senate in March, 2011, which he is now pursuing full time.

Randy and his wife, Marcia, are the parents of twelve children ages 19 to 40 and they have 22 grandchildren. In 2012, Hekman released his most recent book, *Truth that Sets America Free*. •

Gary Glenn
(Republican candidate for United States Senate)



Gary Glenn's candidacy for the U.S. Senate has been endorsed by 50 local TEA Party groups statewide, and by former Governor Mike Huckabee, Right to Life of Michigan PAC, National Right to Work PAC, and Term Limits America PAC.

Gary has served 12 years as president of the American Family Association of Michigan, and is one of two co-authors of the Marriage

Protection Amendment approved by voters in 2004, defining marriage as only between one man and one woman. Gary led the effort that passed Right to Work in Idaho 25 years ago, and he is a founding member of the group promoting freedom and jobs issue in Michigan.

In contrast, 9-term Congressman Pete Hoekstra in past campaigns has been endorsed and funded by Jimmy Hoffa and the teamsters, opposed Right to Work, and co-sponsored a bill that would have given government employee union officials even more power and money by forcing every state and local government in America to unionize its police, fire fighters, and paramedics.

As county commissioner, Gary authored the first Medical Savings Account health insurance plan for county employees in the nation. He served eight years in the Army National Guard.
