

Parental affairs damage children's future

After three years of extensive research, relationships expert Kate Figes broadcast a warning to parents: Your illicit sexual relationships will have a devastating impact on children of all ages.

Even when parents believe their children don't understand or know what is happening, children will sense emotional turmoil in the home. Furthermore, when an affair is discovered, or ends in divorce or separation, children will feel betrayed and deceived.

Other negative effects include low self-esteem, a sense of abandonment, poor performance at school, anti-social behavior and division of loyalty and heartbreak over an absent parent.

However, the worst damage may become evident in adult years, as those who have experienced parental unfaithfulness find it difficult to overcome marital problems or establish lasting relationships. In short, Figes concluded that the infidelity of parents will leave lifelong emotional scars on children, meaning that a constructive stable relationship between a child's two parents is his or her greatest need.
