She and Rep. Terry Sabo, Discuss PFAS Contamination and Solutions in Community Forum
Leaders call for answers and action for safe water for Michigan families

Tanya Cabala, candidate for state representative in Michigan's 91st House District, and State Representative Terry Sabo of the 92nd House District spoke with community members today about PFAS contamination in Muskegon County and the need for state action and transparency for residents. The forum took place today at Oakridge Middle School Auditorium and included Dr. Richard Rediske, Professor of water resources at Grand Valley State University's Annis Water Resources Institute, as well as Michigan environmental policy expert James Clift.

"Michiganers are entitled to safe drinking water, and PFAS contamination, which was hidden for far too long, has caused safety concerns for our families," Cabala said. "Our government is supposed to help protect us from such dangers, and I intend to do just that by getting us answers and action to make our water safe. Just as I worked to clean up White Lake, I'll work to get safe standards and clean up processes to lessen the effects of PFAS, and help our families feel safe."

Cabala, Rep. Sabo, Dr. Rediske, and Clift talked about the health risks of PFAS as well as the need to set a safe, enforceable water quality standard for PFAS in the state.

Passenger Activity at MKG Sees Continued Double Digit Increase

Ottawa County Launches GoFundMe Page for Local Trail Project

All outdoor lovers will soon be able to enjoy a journey along almost 50 miles of recreational trails in Ottawa County with the completion of the Spoonville Trail. Construction of Phase II of the Spoonville Trail, a 1.7-mile-long stretch in Crockery Township is planned to begin this spring.

This beautiful section of trail way will meander through the picturesque ravines of the Terra Verde Golf Course property, making it the first public trail in Michigan with an easement through a golf course. While over 96% of the \$2.3 million project is funded, a small amount remains in order to cross the finish line. FantasMenagerie: The Art of Nat Rosales at Muskegon Museum of Art

Muskegon, MI—The Muskegon Museum of Art will present the sculptures of Michigan artist Nat Rosales in a one-person show from October 18, 2018 through January 13, 2019. *FantasMenagerie: The Art of Nat Rosales* features the fantastical vehicles and creatures Rosales creates from scrap metal, found and manipulated objects, and mechanical parts.

Nat Rosales assembles his sculptures using cast bronze and brass animal sculptures, door and drawer knobs, decorative lamp bodies, gears and drives, various housings, and a host of decorative metal, plastic, and ceramic bric-a-brac. According to MMA Senior Curator Art Martin, "The resulting combinations are a blend of Alice in Wonderland and H.G. Wells, an amalgam of whimsy, fantasy, and mechanics."

FantasMenagerie features over a dozen of Rosales' recent works, a menagerie of vehicles, contraptions, and mechanical-animal hybrids. Formed from found objects and scrap, and inspired by Rosales' life and culture, these fantastical creations invite the viewer along on a journey of magic and exploration.
