Last November, you all showed your support for the Library by passing a ten-year millage. Thank you very much!

This year we had another record year for Summer Reading Program.

372 people signed up for the Program this year, up from 324 last year.

The children read a total 1720 hours – 71 days!

The teens read a total of 310 books!

The adults read a total of 655 books!

I want to thank the Friends of the Fruitport Library for their efforts in obtaining the wonderful prizes we had this year, and every sponsor who donated a prize!




