the Michigan Entrepreneur Resilience Fund has
secured funds to provide recovery grants and loans
to diverse entrepreneurs and small businesses
from underrepresented groups in Michigan. The
application opens today, May 13.

The Michigan Entrepreneur Resilience Fund
will provide two primary avenues of funding:

- Grants: \$1,000 – \$5,000 grants to assist
with reopening or pivoting your business.
- Microloans: \$5,000 – \$10,000 loans with
a 1-3 year repayment period. Loans are fixed rate
(8%), fully amortizing, term loans.
