The importance of giving a woman the ability to see her pre-born baby on an ultrasound scan is so critical and "life-sustaining!" On March 18th, Tim Donovan, of the State Knights of Columbus arranged the demo of the machine for our medical team at Muskegon Pregnancy Services and afterwards it was mentioned the resolution was so clear and amazing that not only could they see the heartbeat, they could also see the compartmental lobes of the little human brain within the womb!

Recently, Governor Whitmer stated that abortions are an essential "life-sustaining" procedure. If that were true, then why is it that abortion clinics don't show women their ultrasound scan or encourage other life-affirming pregnancy options, like adoption? Is it about money? Are they afraid to give women the truth to what they are carrying? Truth is, "They don't want them to SEE their baby," according to Abby Johnson (Unplanned Movie) a former Director of a Planned Parenthood abortion clinic. Even with technology today, the abortion industry continues to tell women the fetus is not a baby "yet", a blob of tissue, with no feeling. However, when they can clearly see their baby on an ultrasound it makes a difference. #### **Covid-19 and Vaccine Considerations and Concerns**

Many are waiting for a Covid-19 vaccine in the hope that it will be the solution to this viral public health threat, could they be waiting in

Covid-19 is a disease caused by the virus SARS-COV-2, which mutated from an animal host to enable it to invade and replicate in human cells. It is a highly contagious virus which in recent findings has been spreading much more rapidly and sooner than was known to be the case two months ago. It continues to mutate and there are now over 20 identifiable strains since it was first identified in Wuhan, China. Graphs which are updated daily can be found on nextstrain.org. Producing a vaccine that is current to mutations circulating when the vaccine is ready for market will be difficult, as we would always be one step behind the virus, if not more.

Other human coronaviruses, including the common cold, induce an immune response but do not produce long-term immunity, as many other types of viruses do. Preliminary reports of Covid-19 antibody testing indicate that some people do not develop much of an antibody response and their antibodies also wane quickly. If infection with the virus does not produce immunity, it is unlikely a vaccine will induce immunity.

The virus is impossible to eradicate and waiting in quarantine for a near-impossible-tomanufacture vaccine is an obsequious effort to lull the population into a false sense of hope and security by local authorities and governments around the world. We should explore other options for dealing with Covid-19. We The People have the right to assess risk for ourselves and those in high risk categories can be enabled to isolate if they so choose.
