

### FRUITPORT COMMUNITY CHURCH CONTINUES RAMP MISSION

Since 2021, Fruitport Congregational Church has been installing, free of charge, portable aluminum ramps for people of this area. The church installs and leaves the ramp onsite for as long as the individual needs it. When no longer needed, the church will remove it and install it in another location.

To qualify, a person must be unable to obtain a rampthrough a government insurance (VA), or their private insurance. The church has an application form to fill out and, if qualified, measurements are taken and a date is set for installation. In 2022, a total of 12 ramps were installed, despite cost increases, thanks to critical donations from the Lions Club and church members.

New Creations in Christ had already shown their commitment to the local community, and their merger with Fruitport Congregational provides even more opportunity for them to serve by supporting this mission. Unified, as Fruitport Community Church, they begin the 2023 season charged with renewed enthusiasm for this critical mission. A stronger financial base, along with a larger team of volunteers gives this endeavor a huge boost!

## Access Health Receives \$6 Million NIH Award to Tackle Barriers to Health and Economic Mobility in Muskegon County

Access Health has secured a groundbreaking \$6 million award from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Common Fund's Community Partnerships to Advance Science for Society (ComPASS) program, a first-of-its-kind initiative. Over the next five years, Access Health will lead an innovative project in Muskegon County to dismantle structural barriers to economic mobility and improved health through a locally created solution to bridge the benefits cliff - with a goal of changing the structures that trap individuals and families in poverty. This initiative will bring together local innovations in healthcare, childcare, and transportation. Access Health, in collaboration with research and community partners, seeks to create a more integrated and effective human services delivery system, marking a significant step in community-led research awarded by NIH.
