Fruitport, June 4 - Starting July 1 Fruitport will have tis own resident doctor, culminating a long effort by the Fruitport Lions club to bring local medical service to the village.

Lions President Russell Kelly said that Dr. James P. Lucie, D.O., will establish an office at 68 S. Third Avenue, in a building formerly operated as the Wagon Wheel Restaurant. He and his family will live in a home on the property.

The club assisted Dr. Lucie in obtaining the property and will aid in the necessary work to convert the building for the doctor's use. Mr. Kelly aid efforts will continue to secure a dentist who may be established in the same building.

Dr. Lucie was born in Buffalo N.Y., in 1928, and attended public schools there. After graduation in 1946 he entered the Army, serving in Panama for two years. He completed his work for his A.B. degree at the University of Buffalo in three years and was graduated in 1951. He entered the Philadelphia College of Osteopathy for four years of study, graduating in 1955, and came to the Muskegon Osteopathic Hospital for one year of internship, which will be completed in June.
