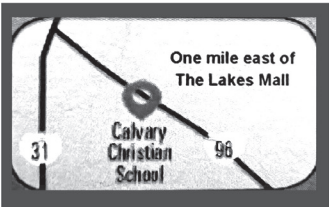

Village of Fruitport Working for You

Small Village. Big Park.

Have you checked out the new Village of Fruitport website yet? It can be found at fruitportvillage.com. It's as pleasant to look at as it is informational. The new website is chock full of pictures of the Village as well as useful information. The website launched in October and will be a work in progress with continuous updating of new information, etc. *FruitportVillage.com* contains information on projects, events, meetings, ordinances, park amenities such as the boat launch and kayak launch, watershed, household waste, etc. Village staff worked in partnership with TRALE, a small marketing and website development company, on design and other technical details. Beginning in March of 2024, park facilities, such as the renting of the picnic shelter and bandshell, will have the option of being reserved through the website. Check it out soon!

The Harbor Transit Trolley made its way through the Village again this summer from Memorial Day through Labor Day. The Pomona Park trolley stop, sponsored by the Village of Fruitport, continued to be one of the most highly used stops on the trolley route. Some of the reasons could be the continued popularity of the new playground, another summer of strong attendance at Dancing into the Sunset, and /or the quiet beauty of visiting Pomona Park, etc. The boat launch and the first full season of the kayak launch also continued to see strong usage this summer.

A new steel roof was put on the bandshell in Pomona Park, and the park basketball court was resurfaced and enlarged. The Village placed beautiful banners near the park along 3rd Street highlighting the new Village logo and motto, "Small Village. Big Park." The flowerpots on 3rd Street were out again this year and they looked good all season thanks to a certain DPW team member's green thumb. Also, Fruitport Village has an EarthCam. It is located at Pomona Park and allows for beautiful views of the park and the waterfront. It can be easily reached through an internet search or through the new Village website at fruitportvillage.com.

Circle Drive was resurfaced with new asphalt and the Village of Fruitport replaced a portion of the sidewalk on 3rd Street. Stormwater infrastructure upgrades were completed by the Village through a contractor at the intersection of 7th Street and Peach Street. The Bridge Street bridge received preventive maintenance through a grant from the Michigan Department of Transportation applied for by the Village, and several other infrastructure improvements were made throughout the Village.

Last but not least, a temporary all-way-stop to ease traffic congestion at the intersection of 3rd Street/Apple Drive/148th Avenue was implemented in early October and will be made permanent in late October/November through a partnership with the Ottawa County Road Commission.

The Village of Fruitport Board and staff will continue to work hard all year and wish everyone a safe winter, a joyous holiday season, and a happy new year.
