Fruitport District Library Homebound Service

The Fruitport District Library and the Friends of the Fruitport District Library are now offering Homebound Service in which library materials can be delivered to Fruitport Township residents who are homebound.

ELIGIBILITY

Homebound service will be provided to residents of Fruitport Township who are not able to come to the library. "Homebound" is defined as being generally confined to the residence either temporarily, due to an illness, accident, or permanently, due to age, disability, or other mobility problems.

REQUIREMENTS TO JOIN:

-Library card

-Fruitport township resident

-Homebound due to injury, illness, disability, low-vision, senior with non-driving status

SCHEDULE

-Once a month, typically the third Thursday

of the month

-Every item needs to be returned unless a renewal has been requested by phone

-A reminder call will be made by the route driver the day before

-Note: pre-contact with the patron is not needed for delivery.

-If a patron cannot participate for the month they are responsible for calling the library to cancel delivery/pick up

-A flyer/slip will be in the dropped-off bags listing the next delivery date

REQUESTING MATERIALS

-Patrons will request specific books by phone prior to the delivery day by contacting the library through email or by phone

-A few days before is preferred

-Types of items available to request:

-books, audiobooks, movies

Save Money by Utilizing Library Digital and Streaming Resources



The Fruitport District Library has resources for everyone to help save money on their streaming and digital services provided with your Fruitport

Libby (formerly known as Overdrive) is the staple of the library world. Access Audiobooks, ebooks, and e-magazines through the Libby app using your library card. Libby is limited to how many copies of a title they have so you may be placed on a waiting list. But we work with ten other library cooperatives across the state to limit your wait time! Check in with the library to gain access to those other cooperatives all with your Fruitport card! In the last year we had over 15,000 items get checked out through Libby!

Hoopla gains you access to e-books, audiobooks, music, comic books, TV shows, and movies all with the use of your Fruitport library card! Hoopla items are available immediately but all items cost the library per use so although the item may be available immediately, the library may have reached its daily budget requiring you to try again the following day. In the last year we had almost 4,000 items get checked out through Hoopla!! Contact the library or download the Hoopla app to discover everything Hoopla has to

Our newest addition to the Fruitport Library is Kanopy! You can download the Kanopy app or access the website through Fruitport.kanopy.com and use your library card to gain access to thousands of movies and TV shows! Every patron receives 25 tickets per month to use on movies and TV shows. All kid's programming is usable without tickets. Watch anything you want immediately! Contact the library for more information or just download the app and get streaming!
