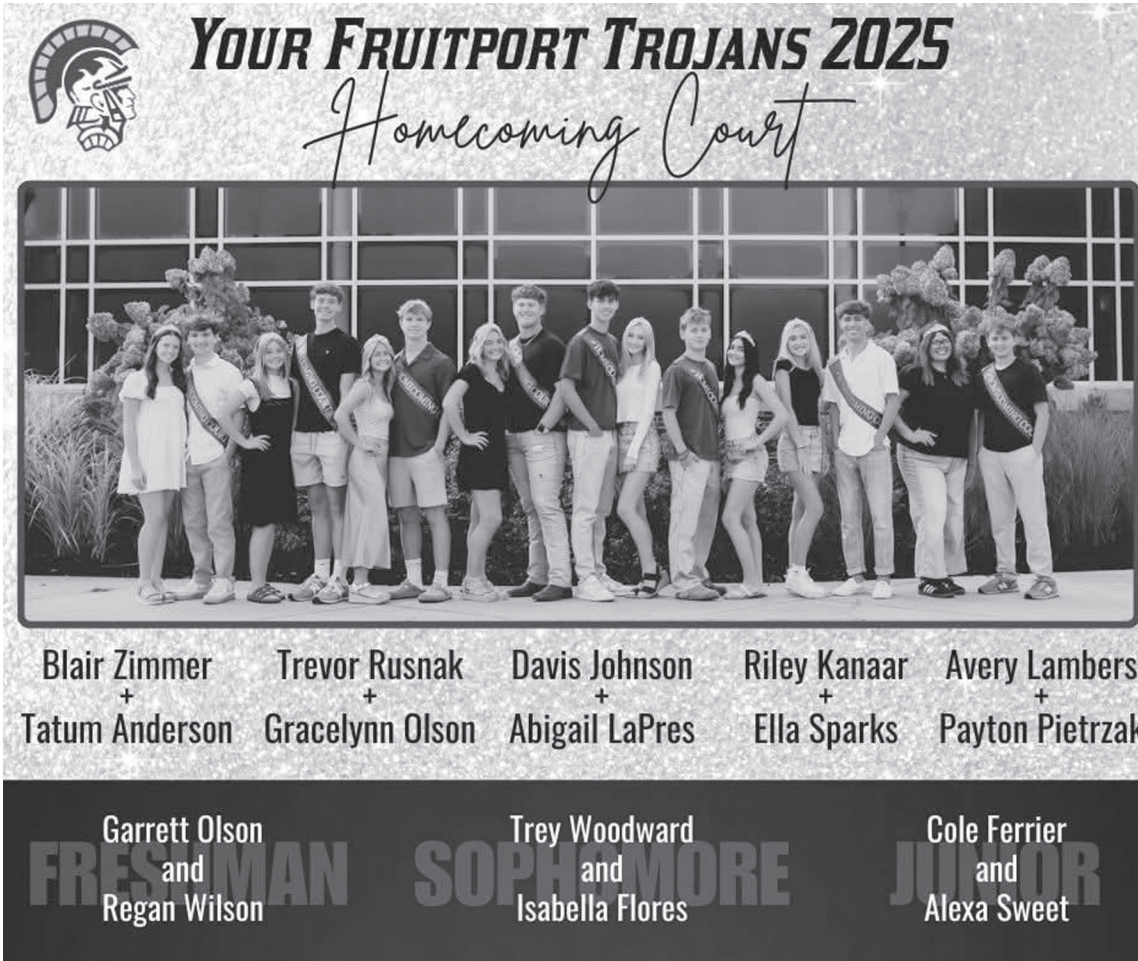
Gracelynn Olson is the daughter of Jared and Debbie Olson and has a younger brother, Garrett, a freshman at Fruitport High School.
